Enrollment Update - Mike	Our Target FTES for enrollment in 16/17 is 5029. CHC is currently anticipating 4,653 generated on campus and 300 FTES through enhanced non-credit-workforce readiness. This constitutes a deficit of 76 FTES. This equates to approximately \$380,000 budget shortfall. However, if we don't achieve the 300 through non-credit, the shortfall will be \$1.5 million.  CHC is working closely with the District EDCT (Richard Galope) to establish partnerships with EDD and other agencies to build this pilot non-credit program for students to fill their needs and obtain the necessary FTES for CHC.  Potentially, the state will fund up to 5112 FES this year. Therefore, if we only were to achieve 4653, this equates to approximately a \$2.3 million budget shortfall. It is critical that we achieve our FTES this year.  We need to look at our processes, improve class scheduling, improve strategic marketing and use a multi-prong approach that will require action by all areas of the institution.  Kathy suggested a student focus group. Amber to talk with the Student Senate and Kathy to visit with them.
