Approval of Minutes for April 25, 2017 and May 9, 2017	The minutes for April 25, 2017 were approved as written and the minutes for May 9, 2017, were approved as corrected.	
Enrollment Update – Mike	Our enrollment target for 2017/2018 is 1.5% above this year. 4,669 x 1.5% = 4,739 However, we would like to aim for a 3% increase which is 4,809. This additional increase must be by productivity only and incur no additional costs. Possible discussion at In-Service Day to talk about ideas to develop a solution to budget issues and develop a budget plan. After discussion, it was decided that it would be better if the President's Cabinet put together a list of what we are working on and a draft plan. Academic Senate indicated they have confidence in our management to put together a draft plan which incorporated all prior discussions. The May revise looks positive.	
Non-Credit – Kathy	We have distributed flyers including to the Yucaipa School District for students to take home. We have sections open, two orientations scheduled and a start date of June 12. Have put it on Facebook, Twitter, advertisements, etc. We are targeting wait-listed students to add sections. Will look at low enrolled sections and determine if they should be cancelled.	

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Committee Chair Training – Rebeccah	<ul> <li>In the past we had annual committee chair training. This has not been done for several years. Rebeccah would like to offer this training in the fall. All new committee chairs on academic senate committees, shared governance committees and standing functional committees should attend this training. PPR Priority	<ul> <li>The President's Cabinet met and reviewed the PPR list presented by the PPR Committee. After some discussion, they made a few changes.</li> <li>Administrative Services, health and safety issues, increased utility costs by opening up additional buildings was moved from Priority 3 to Priority 1.</li> <li>Administrative Services, custodial staffing due to opening up additional buildings and increased workload for existing staff. This was moved from Priority 7 to Priority 2.</li> <li>Instruction – Library/LRC/Technology Center Director. There is not adequate direct oversight of the Library, Tutoring Center and Educational Technology Center, which will open in the fall. This was moved from Priority 8 to Priority 3.</li> <li>After discussion, it was determined that Crafton Council would also like to made a change: <ul> <li>Instruction – Anatomy and Physiology instructor. This item was moved down the list in anticipation of hiring this position. This was moved from Priority 396 to 4.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
