TOPIC	DISCUSSION	Further Action
Approval of Minutes for November 14, 2017	The minutes for November 14, 2017, were approved as written.	
Athletics Update – Mark and Heather	We will offer swimming in Spring 2018 and water polo in Fall 2019. Need to hire a water polo coach by the end of next semester to recruit for the water polo team for a full year prior to the start of the season. The water polo coach will receive the head coach stipend only of \$7,000 for the first year and starting in Fall 2019 will have classes (.47 in season and .34 off season) and the head coach stipend. All athletic students must be enrolled full time. Heather will work with the new dean and the VPI to create the job description.	
BSI/SE/SSSP Integrated Plan – Mark and Rebeccah	Mark stated the Academic Senate moved to approve the BSI/SE/SSSP Integrated Plan with small corrections. Classified Senate also approved. It also went out to the entire campus for review. It is on the December 14, 2017 board agenda for a first read.	
Dual Enrollment – Mark	Mark presented a new form approved by Academic Senate to help Department Chairs plan courses they will offer to high schools. After much discussion it was agreed that this was an internal document developed by Academic Senate for faculty that does not need to be approved by Crafton Council. It does not reflect policy decisions for CHC.	
	Dual Enrollment is an Enrollment Strategies work group. When they put together a process they need to submit it to the Enrollment Strategies Committee (shared governance committee) for review and submission to the Crafton Council. The final document/process will be brought to Crafton Council for approval.	
	Denise stated we need a Dual Enrollment plan and asked who is responsible for writing it and what funding is available. It will be discussed at the President's Cabinet meeting.	

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Finalized IEPI Scorecard Process and Methodology – Keith	Keith took this document to all the senates and all senates recommended approval. At the request of the Academic Senate, Keith added a statement to reflect the possibility that the current approach for setting targets may reach a ceiling. Crafton Council will pay special attention to this when setting targets. By consensus, Crafton Council approves the Finalized IEPI Scorecard Process and Methodology.	
Finalized Guided Self- Assessment for Submission – Keith	Keith presented the finalized Guided Self-Assessment which is due December 23, 2017. This is part of the Guided Pathways grant that we are applying for. There was discussion as some items fall in the "early adoption" phase and some items fall under the "scaling in process" phase. It was decided that overall we would indicate we are in the early adoption phase to better show our growth. Finalized Comprehensive Master Plan Scorecard - Keith	Pathways Self-Assessment report. Keith took this document to all the senates and all senates recommended approval. Draft IEPI Detailed Treatment of Focus Areas - Keith	Keith was selected as then logistics contact person for our upcoming IEPI visit. Per their request, Keith has put together a draft of the detailed treatment of focus for their team. We need to provide this document to them by 01-12-18. Mark will add to the Academic Senate Executive Committee agenda to discuss and let Keith know if there are any changes by Friday, December 15, 2017.	
Draft IEPI PRT Calendar - Keith	Keith put together a draft of the IEPI team visit schedule. After discussion, it was decided to combine some groups and eliminate others. Keith will send out another draft for review.	
Prioritization of the Comprehensive Master Plan Strategic Directions - Keith	Keith presented the analysis of the comprehensive master Plan Strategic Direction Alignment with Objectives to look at the objectives and prioritize them. It shows that Expand Access had the highest priorities of all strategic directions. After discussion, it was agreed that in addition that we would	
	include 7.2.1 and all objectives that received a total score across of 4 or higher because they promote student success. Accordingly, the following objectives were identified as the priorities for 2017-2018: 1.1.4, 4.2.3, 7.2.1, 7.2.6, 9.1.3, and 9.1.5. This will be discussed at the Spring In-Service Day workshop.
