Non-Credit Plan - Denise	the PPR process. Denise reported that Academic Senate appointed a standing committee that worked through the fall term to put together a	
	Non-Credit Plan. The plan addresses the program, specifies the non-credit apportionment is limited to ten categories, suggested implementation guidelines including staffing, courses, minimum qualifications, catalog, etc. After a lengthy conversation, it was agreed upon to include the word "Recommendations" to the heading of the document and change their recommendation that the college will hire 1 additional FT faculty member for every 50 FTES generated by the noncredit program.	
	By consensus , Crafton Council approves the Non-Credit Plan. The next step will to take it to the Enrollment Strategies Committee.

Tess Update - Mike	Mike reported that the District is still discussing the possibility of moving TESS to Crafton. Their concern is the space we are providing is a little small. Mike is working with them for a solution. Their current lease ends in March 2018 and the District is in negotiations with the property owner to try to extend the lease 6-12 months.	
Online Course Caps – Mark	Mark presented Academic Senate Resolution S18.01 regarding online course caps. It was discussed that the class size at census needs to be 35, not at the beginning of the course to be sustainable. Mike asked how do we incentivize growth for Crafton?	
NSF Grant - Mark	Academic Senate is okay with the grant application as long as no major changes or modifications.	
Guided Pathways – Mark	Per Keith our submission for the Guided Pathways is due on March 30, 2018. Mark indicated that Academic Senate has several volunteers to review the document and it will go to Academic Senate for approval at their 03-21-18 meeting.	
Prioritization of the Comprehensive Master Plan Strategic Directions - Keith	Keith presented the analysis of the comprehensive master Plan Strategic Direction Alignment with Objectives to look at the objectives and prioritize them. It shows that Expand Access had the highest priorities of all strategic directions. After discussion, it was agreed that in addition that we would include 7.2.1 and all objectives that received a total score	
	across of 4 or higher because they promote student success. Accordingly, the following objectives were identified as the priorities for 2017-2018: 1.1.4, 4.2.3, 7.2.1, 7.2.6, 9.1.3, and 9.1.5. This will be discussed at the Spring In-Service Day workshop.
