Approval of minutes for August 24, 2021	The minutes for 8-24-21 were approved as written. Motion by Keith, seconded by Brandi. No abstentions. Unanimous approval.	
Update from District Institutional Effectiveness Committee regarding the Ed Master Plan Process – Christopher Crew and Gio	Christopher Crew from the District Office of Research and Planning presented an overview of the process to update to the Educational Master Plan. Over the summer EMSI worked on the feedback they received from all three district sites for the environmental scan. That updated document was released last week.	
	The next step is moving forward to find a consultant to work on the Educational Master Plan and the RFP went out on August 26, 2021. Proposals are due 10-8-21. According to the timeline, consultant applications will be reviewed, the top three will be forwarded for interviews and hoping to get cabinet approval in November and Board approval in December. That gives the selected consultant six months to get the Educational Master Plan document complete. The consultant will work with the colleges to finish their college plan and then will pull together the data into one plan	
AP/BP Standards of Student Conduct AP 5500 Student Conduct – Joe Cabrales	for the District. Academic Senate requested review of AP 5500 Student Conduct to include more descriptive detail and examples when possible. Joe reviewed their feedback and agreed that some of the procedures were antiquated and needed updating. Joe looked at other colleges and legal language and drafted some updated language which he presented today.	
	Academic Senate requested that the BP be written in order of severity instead of alphabetically by type. Academic Senate requested to address the zoom situations as this is a new platform since the AP/BP was originally written.	

AP/BP Standards of Student Conduct AP 5500 Student Conduct (continued)	After the discussion today, Joe will fine tune his draft and send it to Academic Senate for another review. Once this is completed, Joe needs to review the drafted changes with SBVC and then it needs to go to District Assembly for approval.	
Finalization of Institutional Set Standards - Keith	Last spring, Crafton Council reviewed the Institutional Set Standards recommended changes, it went to all the senates in April and Keith is bringing it back to Crafton Council for final approval.	
	Keith reviewed the changes: Approximately 5-6 years ago ACCJC required colleges to set standards. If we fell below those standards, we need to define resources to correct. The IEAOC defined those standards initially. The IEAOC is now recommending changes to two of these standards:	
	Transfers. Our current standard is 163 and we have exceeded that number significantly in the past several years. They would like to increase that number to 338.	
	Degrees. Our current standard is 250 and we have exceeded that number significantly in the past several years. They would like to increase that number to 428.	
	Motion to approve the revision to the Institutional Set Standards was made by Mike. Seconded by Meridyth. No abstentions. Unanimous approval.
