Approval of minutes for August 23, 2022	The minutes for 08-23-22 were approved as written. Motion for approval of minutes made by Meridyth, seconded by Julie. No opposition. No abstentions. Motion approved.	
Crafton Student Services Reorganization – Kristina Hannon and Delmy	<ul> <li>Kristina Hannon spoke about some changes to the job titles for two existing Student Services Directors. Each position was reviewed during the management classification study and it was determined there were some disparities with similar positions at SBVC and the amount of work justified a higher level job title. Over time these directors have been given added responsibilities/programs:</li> <li>The Director of EOPS has been reclassified to Associate Dean, Student Equity and Success. This position includes EOPS/CARE/CalWORKs/Guardian Scholars.</li> <li>The Director of Student Life has been reclassified to Associate Dean of Student Engagement. This position includes oversight of Basic Needs Center (a new mandate from the State Chancellor's Office) which includes food insecurities, mental health, Cal Fresh and other support services for students, Student Senate, and student activities.</li> <li>These reclassifications were approved at the September board. Still need to finalize some other new job</li> </ul>	
	descriptions. The target for those is the December board meeting.	

Crafton Student Services Reorganization (continued)	In addition, Kristina shared a DSO (District Support Operations) proposed Restructure Reorganization plan that will reduce DSO costs by approximately \$43,628 (dollar amount received from HR Office). This proposed plan is based on present and future needs of SBCCD as a whole, and includes built-in succession planning, alignment of work, and a vision of future requirements for each department. Kristina offered to go to Senate meetings and speak with CSEA regarding any questions. The target is to go to December board.	
Collegiality in Action Training (Participatory Governance) Kevin and Brandi	<ul> <li>There is a formal program jointly offered by CCLC and the statewide Academic Senate on participatory government. It is a refresher training on what each constituency role is. It is roughly two hours. We would like wide classified participation along with management and faculty. Kevin asked what everyone's preference would be for format (zoom or in person) and who should participate. We received several ideas:</li> <li>In January in-person and district wide during inservice day.</li> <li>In January in-person and have a training for Crafton by itself and a training with the District and CHC together (a separate training for SBVC)</li> <li>January zoom format and have a training for Crafton by itself and a training with the district and CHC together (a separate training for SBVC)</li> <li>Kevin will take this information back to Chancellor's</li> </ul>	
Common Application Project Update - Delmy	Cabinet. Delmy shared they are working on a project that will allow students to apply once and can register and take courses at either college campus. Currently they must apply to each campus. We are on track with this project and hopefully will be implementing in October or November for Spring 2023 registration. They will be putting language on the webpage for District, SBVC and CHC to let students know they can register for either college.	
Web Advisor Update - Keith	Web Advisor will no longer be supported by Ellucian. The District needs to move to Ellucian's Self Service. We have no choice because Ellucian is going to turn off Web Advisor and replace with Self Service. Three faculty were appointed by the Academic Senate in March 2022 to provide input. In addition, TESS has also been getting input from Crafton Counselors. Since most of Web Advisor for faculty includes external links, faculty will not be largely impacted by the move. However, there may be a minor impact. Luke is working on a demo to show Academic Senate and Faculty Chairs.
