The state is offering a 100% construction grant to the selected colleges. No guarantee to receive the grant. 	

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Standing Item: Student Housing (continued)	Mike will speak with Dr. Horan about using Crafton Council as the user group for this project along with select other individuals. This project will move very quickly as the grant is due on July 3 rd . It will require board approval in June which means the grant needs to be finalized by the first of May. If we are selected, they should start funding in 2023- 2024. It would take 8 months to finalize the design and another 6 months for DSA approval. Should start construction in 2025. The site is adjacent to the solar field and the consultant is looking at placement of the housing that would allow us a collegiate size soccer field. We will also integrate the garden space.
