<p>Student Housing Discussion – Volz Company and HPI Architecture</p>	<p>Volz Company and HPI Architecture presented information about the student housing construction grant application including the 4 strategic objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure financial viability (needs to be able to pay for itself) • Provide quality, affordable & accessible housing • Address basic needs and concerns for students • Increasing student recruitment <p>They completed an on-line student survey with lots of responses. They also completed a market demand analysis. The current funding from the state is for single student housing (no children or partners) and they discussed three room types: single bedroom for one student (10 units); two-bedroom semi-suite with one student per bedroom (36 units) and a two-bedroom semi-suite with 2 students per bedroom (168 units). Each unit has its own bathroom and kitchenette. Discussed the potential site location next to the solar field and a backup location in Lot M. They will integrate the community garden into the Student Housing plan. The target rent prices need to be 10% below the max cap to be competitive and needs to cover the operational costs.</p> <p>This is a one-time grant opportunity and is a competition. The application is due 7-3-23 and needs to be board approved at the June board meeting so Volz Company will be finalizing the application in May. Currently, they are also meeting with student focus groups for input.</p>
