Construction Update- Mike	The Performing Arts Theater just received state approval. The groundbreaking is scheduled for 5-31-23. The fences will go up soon and they will start transporting dirt during the summer.	
	The renovation of the Child Development Center will include the front building and child classrooms and will be ready for Fall 2023 semester in August.	
	We are moving into the Design Development for the Instruction Building. The Programming Confirmation Phase has been completed and the architect will take the information they received and start to build a schematic design, design development and floor plans over the summer. This will not be finalized until after the start of the Fall semester so everyone can participate in the Design Development phase.	
	Central Complex 2 will be renovated. This includes Physics and math departments. The construction is scheduled to start in January for 8-9 months and we want to be done prior to the start of Fall 2024 semester.	
	Crafton Hall renovation will start in December 2023 for 10 months and should end in September 2024. This will impact our opening day all campus meeting for Spring 2024.	
Standing Item: Student Housing - Mike	We will be finalizing the grant application in the next week. It will be completed on 5-16-23 and will go to the June board for Board of Trustees approval. The grant application is due to the State on July 3, 2023. We should know where we stand sometime in January 2024 with funding due in July 2024.
