Wurtz Revision of Principles and Guidelines for Budget Increase and Reduction - Mike	Mike reviewed the Principles and Guidelines for Budget Increase and Reduction which was adopted in November, 2020. This document provides principles to apply if ever the budget is reduced or increased. This document is also being shared with Shared Governance to review. It was noted that adjustments may need to be made to the four service levels. It was discussed that examples should be given to assist with categorizing items in each service levels. An example of a level 4 could possibly be travel and a level 3 could possibly be additional Professional Development. Ultimately adjustments would be made to safeguard the students. Mike offered to sit in the Senate Meetings to offer assistance when reviewing this document. Meridyth noted that planning service levels should be started in the Planning Program Review meetings. Crafton Hills College saw a 12% growth rate year to date which equates to 130 FTES. However our FTES funding baseline resets on 2025-2026, we would need approximatley 400 more FTES by 2025-2026 to get back to pre-pandemic levels.
