Review and approve minutes from 10-10-23	Minutes approved as written. Motion for approval of minutes made by Enggie, seconded by Kevin L. No opposition. No abstention. Motion approved.	
Enrollment Strategies Membership Revision - Keith	After discussion, it was decided to make no changes.	
Safety Committee Charge and Membership - Mike	Reviewed the suggested changes to the charge (dates) and membership. Motion for approval by Kevin L., seconded by Delmy. No opposition. No abstention. Motion approved.	
Facility Master Plan Update - Mike	The intent is to update the Facilities Master Plan document to align with the new Educational Master Plan. We have a consultant, DLR Architects, going to February board for approval. They will be assisting the whole district.	
	DLR will meet with Crafton Council first, start information gathering and meet with all Senates before the end of Spring semester. They will be creating a rough draft over the summer. In Fall semester, they will be returning to all Senates for feedback and review and returning to Crafton Council for final approval. After that it is scheduled to go to the Board of Trustees for approval in February 2025.	
Budget Update - Mike	In January the Governor presented his draft budget. The state budget needs to be approved in June. The Governor indicates there is a 37.9 billion dollar deficit and attributed this on the declne in the stock market and an unprecidented delay in tax collections. SBCCD is not seeing a big decline and will remain fairly stable in our funding with very small COLA of .76%. The State indicates it will take some funding from the Rainy-Day Fund to support the Student Centered Funding Formula.	
	We are concerned with the 2025-2026 budget and remain focused on increasing enrollment. Keith added	

	that enrollment is 16% higher than this time last year. However, compared to Spring 2020, we are 248 FTES below (roughly 12% down). This equates to roughly 83 sections we need to add and fill between now and the end of 2024-25 to get back to 2018-19 FTES levels. We ranked 9 out of 32 housing grant applications with the State. The state is only funding \$75 million and in order for us to be included, they would need to fund in excess of \$475 million. However, we are in the queue.
