Timeline for EMP - Gio	Gio shared a few slides from Christopher Crew's presentation to Crafton Council on 09-14-21. The District is undergoing the process of hiring a consultant to revisit and update the Educational Master Plan document. Come January we will have consultants in place and already have the strategic priorities from the Board of Trustees that will be incorporated into the document. That gives us Spring semester to work closely with the consultants and finalize our Educational Master Plan document.	
Environmental Scan - Gio	For the next couple of months, we will be working through the environmental scan document to familiarize ourselves with the information, so we are prepared to start working with the consultants in January to write the updated Educational Master Plan document.  As we read through the document, these are the items we need to address:  • Where the district should logically target its efforts  • Industries that may be overlooked as a result of recent economic growth  • Top occupations within those key driving industries  • Deeper understanding of the region's population characteristics and the socioeconomic background of current and future SBCCD students	
	Another key data point is the gaps that exist in our labor markets that reflect the number of those individuals who are earning those awards relative to the number of job openings for those corresponding programs. Emsi did a great job of	

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Environmental Scan - Gio	isolating those gaps at three different levels: certificate level, degree level and the BS level which is pertinent to us too, because of our emphasis on transfer programs as well.  Gio stated that Emsi indicated that some of the data points that we inquired about are actually available to us through another platform that our Research Office has access to.  Kevin suggested as a way to move this discussion forward that we have a high-level overview of the scan presented to this group from Research and Planning Office. This would include where the greatest opportunities may reside and where the greatest challenges may exist for us. This would be a great place to start and we can build the conversation from there.  Gio will prepare a handful of slides that highlights some of the key focus areas in the document for next meeting.  Cyndie will resend the final environmental scan document today to each member so they can review it before our next meeting discussion.  Mission, Vision and Value statements are almost complete. Gio needs to meet with Classified Senate. He has already met with Academic Senate and Student Senate. Once he meets with Classified Senate, he will bring it back to Crafton Council to review all the input and make any additional changes. The final version will be a guiding force for our master plan.
