Strategic Directions 1,2,3 - Gio	At the last meeting there were questions whether the links provided were in fact the most current version of events. Gio sent out links prior to the meeting for everyone to review and put comments in.	
	Gio indicated that there are two types of Key Accomplishments – the Board update which has a 500 character limit and the Chancellor's Notes which has not character limit.
