HONORS ACTIVITY POINTS (DRAFT)

All new College Honors Institute students who begin taking Honors classes in Fall 2021 or later are expected to complete 100 Honors Activity Points per semester or 200 per academic year to complete the Honors program. This requirement is in addition to the ongoing requirement of maintaining a cumulative 3.25 GPA in transferable courses, completing 15 Honors units, and completing 15 community service hours. If an Honors student began the program before Fall 2021, they are not required to complete the 100 activity points, but they are certainly encouraged to do so.

Honors Activity Points can be earned for a variety of recognized Honors or Honors-related events. As new events develop, the list will grow. To earn the points, you will need to go to the event and have someone associated with the event sign your scoresheet. In cases where that is not possible (such as a Zoom event or a large conference), you should report your attendance to the Honors Coordinator with a short write-up within a week of attending the event.

You may turn in your scoresheets at any time during the semester to the Honors Coordinator. Currently, these are the activities that will earn Honors points:
