## Bryan Reece reported:

After a discussion with Department Chairs, Deans, and the Budget Committee, a consensus could not be reached regarding enrollment caps. For now, it was decided to use the current model.

The State will be moving into a new Curriculum Inventory.
Letters are being emailed to the students affected by the title change of their majors due to the varying emphases that were consolidated into six primary degrees.

As of December 2015 we have had to send Stand Alone courses to the State for approval. Campuses will now be allowed to approve Stand Alone courses at the local level.
