The certificate holder is able to install and configure Cisco switches and routers in multi-protocol networking using LAN and WAN interfaces, can provide Level 1 troubleshooting service, can improve network performance and security, and can perform entry-level task in the planning, design, installation, operations, and troubleshooting of Ethernet and TCP/IP networks. Completion of the following 12.00 units qualifies the student for the Cisco Certified Network Associate Certificate.
