A. CD 100 Introduction to Early Childhood Education

B. CD 133 Creative Science and Math Activities for Children

- New Catalog Description: This is the first semester of a one-year course in organic chemistry with lab intended for majors in the natural sciences (chemistry, biochemistry, biology, physics, and pre-medicine). Examines carbon compounds including structure, nomenclature, functional groups, reactivity, synthesis, and reaction mechanisms.
 Spectroscopy and modern theoretical concepts studied. Laboratory includes preparation, identification, and the study of properties of organic compounds.
- **New Schedule Description:** First semester of a two-semester organic chemistry sequence. Study of modern organic chemistry including structure, nomenclature, reactivity, synthesis, and reaction mechanisms. Lab techniques include purification, isolation, synthesis reactions, and spectroscopic analysis.

O. ETHS 106 Introduction to Women's Studies Through an Ethnic Studies Lens

Also offered as SOC 106. This course is a critical part of a comprehensive ethnic studies and women's studies program at the community college level. It also will provide students an introduction to women's studies with an emphasis on women's history, critical race theory and gender theory in order to increase students' appreciation and understanding of diversity. This course is associate degree applicable and transfers to CSU.

Troy's Report

- Troy will contact Kristina regarding the updates for local GE Patterns for new courses after she receives the results from CSU and IGETC.
- It was agreed based on Troy's recommendation to add MUSIC 101 to CHC GE Area C2 because Title 5 change requires that California community colleges award general education credit for an appropriate score on the AP Music Theory exam.
- IGETC will include Area 7, Ethnic Studies, in Fall 2023. Community colleges will receive guidance this month, IGETC Standards will be updated, and community colleges will propose courses for the new area in December 2022.
- Part of AB 928 requires a single transfer-level GE pattern for CSU and UC. That pattern will be effective Fall 2025 and will likely require modification of some CHC courses.
- Gwen's Report
- The Curriculum Committee is requesting more support from administration to hold training opportunities during the summer for faculty and staff to learn Meta.
- Kim's Report
- On June 1, the college will be switching over to Meta. The old CurricUNET system will run in the background, but you will not be able to make changes to the system. Everyone will use the same login information as they do now. If you forget your password, you can reset it yourself. Also, we will have a single sign in system.
- Kim will request a list of equates from Kelly or Christina because all the equates will have to be done manually. Also, some of the cross-list courses will need to be fixed.
- Kim will send out the new User Guide to the campus.
