z. RESPIRATORY CARE CRAFTON—BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE (to see course outline go to SEARCH, COURSES in CurricUNET)*

Rationale: The Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Care will prepare individuals to fill existing and emerging needs in the Healthcare System that require handling complex systems and uncertain environments. Additionally, the American Association for Respiratory Care, the California Society for Respiratory Care, the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care, and the Respiratory Care Board of California support the advancement of the entry level degree requirement for respiratory care licensure being elevated to a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree in Respiratory Care. To accomplish this, colleges must begin to transform from Associate level programs to Bachelor's level programs. The goal for this entry level requirement is the year 2030. Moreover, graduates will be qualified for leadership positions throughout the field of Respiratory Care. Special emphasis will be placed on using process and tools to deal with complex problem solving, advanced skills, advanced theories, organizational structures, and leadership principles.
