

Mr. Jones makes the following speech at a meeting attended by several hundred people sympathetic to his cause. There are also several hundred other people from the community, including reporters and government officials, in attendance. After a brief introduction, Mr. Jones says:

“My friends, it is time we stopped being pushed around. The principal of the school is an evil pervert, thief, bigamist, liar, communist, and Satanist! And there are teachers at the school who should be fired for practicing atheism! We have demanded that the School Board fire them, but our demands have fallen on deaf ears. If the Board, who we elected, won’t stop perverts and atheists from having access to our children in the classroom, then I say we march over there right now and burn down the school!”

Mr. Jones is arrested before he can finish the rest of his speech. In court, he tells the judge that all charges should be dropped, since the police have violated his First Amendment rights.

1. **Upon what grounds and with what evidence** would the police and local district attorney likely claim that, in this case, the **First Amendment does not protect** Mr. Jones?
2. Mr. Jones is subsequently **sued** by the school’s principal. **For what, and upon what grounds?**
3. **What part of the First Amendment** would be violated, **and how** would it be violated, if the School Board were to accede to Mr. Jones’ demands regarding the firing of certain teachers?
