New Business 1. Engage, Learn, Advance Multimedia Project: Strategic Discussion # 2	 Bryan: All faculty have something that they already do in their classes that enable them to truly interact and connect with students. We need to find a way to capture and share these ideas. One idea to capture this is to use our Crafton Website and add a tool to the PD website as shown to the right (handout provided in the meeting). Last week, the committee watched one complete video, showing a sample of an idea presented by Jimmy. Both ideas are great. We would love to do both, but cost is obviously a factor. Produced videos would be much more expensive than the website option. Who is the intended audience? This needs to be determined. The produced vidoes could be used as a marketing tool but require more resources. The website would be directed for faculty and be simpler to impliment. 	Bryan: discuss resources and ideas with KCVR to see if they are interested in taking part.

	 Website could be used as a template, then faculty could decide if they want to provide audio clips, video clips, and/or pictures. We could do this all in-house, or work with KCVR. A comments section should be added so we know the popularity of each video. The popular ones we can then make those into higher quality produced videos. Some feel this project is recreating the wheel, and to a point it is, but it does so much more. The website and videos can show off what WE do as a campus, introduce students to faculty members and their styles, provide professional development activities, be used as a marketing tool, help build a brand Equity and Student Success may be a possible source on monitary resouces. 	
2. Progress on Outcomes Assessment and IEAOC Plans	 Outcomes will reviewed every year (flex/in-service) in terms of assessments, data/outcomes, action plans, and implimentation. Keith shared our results on assessments that have taken place up through 15-16 academic year thus far. Results need to be made accessible to the public, but to what degree is not yet specified. Office of Research and Planning wants to step back and have faculty take more of a leadership role in the assessment process: holding/hosting campus wide discussion, trainings, and presentations. Currently, any course about 8 students enrolled is expected to be assessed. New online tool is available through the Office of Research and Planning Website, "SLO Course Assessment Outcome Rates," that shows what courses have been assessed, when they were assessed, and if they need to be assessed. 	
3. New DSPS and PD Initiative: Reducing Stigma	 First event is scheduled on October 13th. The goal is to make this ongoing. Alicia wasn't here to discuss it but we will bring this back to the next meeting so she can explain it better. 	
4. Review of Fall Plan to Implement PD for New and Aspiring Faculty	 Dean read a memo that will go out to new and experienced faculty to start the opportunity for faculty interaction and the formation of "teaching pals." Teaching pals will be able to inform the committee on the needs of our faculty and allow us to address those needs as a committee. There are a couple of books that were shown that can enable PDC to start creating new workshops for various teaching topics for new and returning faculty. Tina and Dean will be hosting (or finding others who want to host) the first group of workshops
