Reports	Budget Update  Current Balance in checking: \$224,224.21  Merrill Lynch investments: \$2.1 million (*unrealized gain since 7/1/18 is \$309,126.24).  Total income since 7/1/18: \$263,933.00 (*Includes the \$100,000 from San Manuel for student workers and scholarships).  Total expenses since 7/1/18: \$245,223.47  Overall, we are tracking well to hit the projected revenue of \$302,001.82  Michelle estimates the gala expenses will be around \$25,000 this year, and we still have to pay out about \$15,000 in scholarships.  College Promise ask of \$53 million for San Manuel discussed and how it may impact the Foundation  Sam requested totals of each of the contractors' gala contributions over the last few years. HMC and PMSM have both stayed on as Pres. Circle members since work has been completed.  Audit expense – committee discussed would like to keep Ray Ashworth this year, but go to bids for possibly changing next year.  College Update  Spring classes starting 1/14/19.  College Promise Discussions – working on how the program would actually work. It is to be a 2-year program where college fees are covered, every student would receive a laptop, transportation allowances, book allowances, etc. Will impact the student success formula as it integrates well with state initiatives.  The District plans to match the \$53 million with an investment.  ISEEK Student worker program would go away, but student employment may be a component of the new Promise program.	Michelle to give contractor sponsor levels to Sam/committee for prior years and who has participated.

	<ul> <li>The CHC Foundation could still employ student workers on a smaller scale if they do not meet the eligibility requirements to participate in the College Promise program.</li> <li>S.A.C. Clinic President would like to work with the District to offer more opportunities for the students.</li> <li>Concern was expressed that contractors may give to the "Inland Futures Foundation", rather than the individual Crafton and Valley Foundations. If this happens, we will need to focus on other funding sources.</li> <li>Resource Development Update</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Foundation needs to focus on other funding sources. We recently received \$10,000 for scholarships for EMT/Paramedic students.</li> <li>We provided Transfer Application Fee Waivers</li> <li>Provided food for STEM students to encourage them to stay on campus and study for finals.</li> <li>VRC expenses still being provided for by VRC fund. Expenses are office supplies and food/snacks and to help individual Veteran Students. David Raley would like to be notified about future Veteran events.</li> </ul>
