Budget Update

- Revenue at 61% we are on target for meeting the projected budget.
- Balance Sheet Art values are reflected at the bottom of the balance sheet.
- Merrill Lynch investment total gain of \$309k this year; checking/savings account balance is \$228k (checking is \$157k); Community bank balance is \$10,553.17 and will remain open until after the credit card processing at the gala.

College Update

- Promise Program *still in development stages. For 1st time college students, will help with transportation expenses, transfer application fees, a tablet or chromebook, and summer bridge program.
- Promise Program Issues/Obstacles Textbook costs will vary between majors, so discussion on covering all required textbooks; as it is currently written, it does not address summer sessions; childcare/transportation expenses will vary, so considering adding \$300 to Financial Aid VISA card to cover these misc. expenses; Peer mentoring/tutoring to be a type of student worker opportunity; chromebooks may be better to rent out, as not useful to all majors and no support for repairs as needed.
- Promise Program Goal 1000 students, 300 from Crafton; with a Fall launch of the program, will focus on enrollment from first-time students who have completed a FAFSA.
- Bond Projects currently prioritizing and reassessing costs of projects; believe some of the projects are over-estimated, can save money by tightening budgets; current Crafton priorities

MR to move \$10k from the Community Bank account to Merrill Lynch investment.

	are renovation of PAC, West, and Crafton Hall; New Construction for Regional Fire Training Center (9 fire agencies have already expressed support of this project); the gym is also being looked at and discussed to tear down and possibly rebuild in the future. Gym and soccer field may help push Crafton athletic program. • Sam suggested contacting the "Benchwarmers" in Redland to help support the gym project. Rochford is also a supporter of the Benchwarmers. Resource Development Update	Bill to put in a good word with the Community Foundation for the need for this grant.
