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Overview of accomplishments for 2017

- Awarded \$112,450 in scholarships to 130 students
- Through the ISEEK grant, we provided employment opportunities for 60 students in 20 departments across the campus. We currently have 45 students employed on and off-campus
- At the California Dreamin' gala we raised \$99,615
- We have provided \$8,902 in Emergency Textbook Loans to help 48 students continue their education.
- We provided funding for: Roadrunner Rally, HS Visitation Day, Arts Day, Student Recognition Dinner, Three Peaks Challenges, Herbivore Festival, Grad Breakfast, Tea with the Deans, Honors Institute, Veterans Resource Center, Fire Academy, COACH, Transfer fees, and the Study Abroad Program.

Overall in 2016-2017, the CHC Foundation raised \$721,037 and infused \$352,974 back into the College. The CHC Foundation holds 2.6 million in assets.

But, the most important part of what we do is helping students like Jeremiah Lucas who we were able to help with the Inland Empire United Way Grant.



Since I graduated from High School I wanted to enter college to become a fire fighter.
