Four students were not assessed Lack of general attendance and a resulting lack of completion of projects. appears to be connected to students not achieving the level of understanding of the course information Students who were not assessed did not attend the final exam, where the assessment was conducted. This does not impact the overall success of the program as attendance issues are symptomatic of academia at large. The majority of students successfully achieved the slos as evidenced by the assessment. Of the 20 students who met or exceeded the slos, I feel that their success dialogue and project completion as the slos are an indicator of retention and understanding of the course information upon completion of the course.
