2. Means of Assessment (Measurement Method)

Class Assignment: Card File

200 point Card File

Students will read 100 Children's Books and record basic information in a file card format. Further information will be shared in class. See guideline sheet for assistance. **Due November 17.**

zCD 134 Literature File

- 1. Read 100 children's books. Avoid golden books, cardboard books, etc. If you choose a book from a series i.e. Spot, Franklin, Clifford etc. use only one book from the series. Any additional books from the series will not be counted toward your goal of 100.
- 2. Use a format that includes the following information:
 - 1. Title
 - 2. Author
 - 3. Age Appropriate example (3-5)
 - 4. Brief description (1 paragraph)
 - 5. Thematic Unit/Units
 - 6. Any other relevant information you deem appropriate
- 3. Present your information in a professional format. Card file, notebook, small container etc. Make sure your cards or papers will stay together. If you use a card file, be sure to put a rubber band around your box to prevent disaster if your card file should spill.
- 4. Divide your book choices by using thematic units. Include a minimum of ten thematic units, however you may have many more. Use tabs or a similar system to divide your choices. Remember a book choice may be used only once. Example: Brown Bear by Bill Martin Jr. may be filed under the Thematic Unit of Colors OR perhaps Bears. Whatever your choice as a place to file, list additional units for which that book could be applicable. You may include other relevant information here also. Example for Brown Bear: Thematic Units: Colors, Bears, Farm Animals, Sequencing (Math concept). It will count as only one book.
- 5. All information will be typed in typical font (10 or 12) Avoid simply using the information shared by Barnes & Nobel or Amazon etc in your paragraph description as this will result in a major point loss. While each card is worth one point BE AWARE it is an all or nothing point for each card/paper.
- 6. Submit your information in a professional manner on the due date. Include this guideline sheet when turning in your assignment.
- 7. Your project will be graded on content, depth and mechanics as well as completion and comprehension.

3. Criteria for Success (Benchmark)

The department benchmark is 55% of the students will complete the assignment with 70% accuracy.

4. Summary of Evidence

11 of the 26 students completing the assignment scored in the 70% or higher. 11 students scored in the "A" range. 0 students scored in the "B" range, 0 students fell in the "C" range and 4 student fell in the "D" range. 4 students did not pass the paper. 6 did not attempt the project. The Child Development students by far successfully completed the project.

5. Use of Results (Implications for Program Improvement & Planning)

Remind students at the beginning of the semester that the course requires time out of class and long term planning to complete the Literature activity project.
