Child Development Center Meeting Notes Nov. 3, 2006

The following items were discussed in the November 3rd Child Development Center Committee meeting.

The purpose of the committee established by the Academic Senate.

The proposed changes in the Children's Center Director position.

It was indicated that any currently employed personnel would be required to apply and compete for the Classified Supervisor position proposed by the SBCCD.

Funding sources for the proposed position were discussed.

The following options were identified.

- Since the SBCCD district recommended the change in the Center Director status ask the district to fund the position using district monies rather than campus specific monies.
- 2) Crafton Hills College and Valley college sharing a Program Director
- 3) Crafton Hills College having a Site Supervisor replace the Center Program Director position recognizing the district currently does not have a position of that type in place. The following options were discussed as methods for that position to be funded.
 - a. A faculty person would be reassigned time to serve as the Site Supervisor (possible .20 reassign time)
 - b. Site Supervisor in a classified position would function as the secretary/office personnel as well as the Site supervisor.
 - c. Use current personnel (Lab school class room teacher/teachers) to function as the site supervisor in the absence of a Program Direct on campus, should a position of one Programs Director for the district be established. This raised questions adequate of parent/program over site.
- 4) Split a faculty position to serve both as faculty and as the Program Director recognizing the two areas that would be required of this position include both teaching and supervising Lab School employees. Thus requiring two types of evaluations.
- 5) As a possible new position is created (Classified supervisor) stipulation be made that person would be responsible for grant monies etc. that would serve to off set the cost of the Center Director Position.

A walking tour of the center was conducted.

Additional items discussed included:

- equity between Valley College and Crafton Hills College in maintaining an academic program to serve as a training institution of future teachers of young children.
- Recognition of other programs that interact with the Lab School

- o Paramedic program
- o Interpersonal Communication Speech class
- o Local High Schools ROP programs

It was suggested a draft of a resolution be written to be discussed at the nest meeting and upon completion of that process the resolution be submitted to the Academic Senate.

The next meeting was set for Thursday November 9th at 1:00 p.m.
