Resolution S08.01 Catalog Rights

Whereas, current educational policy allows students to preserve their catalog rights throughout five years of non-attendance;

Whereas, this length of time far exceeds that of most other community colleges, including San Bernardino Valley College, whose catalog rights extend through one year of non-attendance;

Whereas, the Chancellor has expressed an interest in the length of time students preserve their catalog rights being the same at both colleges;

Whereas, shortening the length of time students preserve their catalog rights increases the likelihood they will meet more current graduation requirements;

Resolved, That the Crafton Hills College Academic Senate recommend that continuous attendance be defined as attendance in at least one semester at Crafton Hills College with a break of less than one year; and

Resolved, That the Crafton Hills College Academic Senate recommend that students in continuous attendance may choose to meet the graduation requirements in effect at the time they first attended the college or those in effect at the time they graduate; and

Resolved, That the Crafton Hills College Academic Senate recommend that students who have had a break in attendance of one year or more may choose to meet the graduation requirements in effect at the time of their readmission or those in effect at the time they graduate.
