In the committee's estimation, the external team did a very good job of consulting key individuals and groups, conducting itself in a professional manner, and publicizing a time when any person could meet with them. Improvement was needed in the composition of the team (too few faculty), the preparation of some, but not all members of the team, the and quality of the exit report.
