1. Approval of minutes from February 9, 2015 meeting

The minutes were approved with corrections.
2. Action Items

COURSE MODIFICATIONS

A. GEOL 190 Geology of the Eastern Sierra Nevada, Northern Section

The Departmental Recommendation has been updated to be consistent with other field courses.

The committee agreed to approve GEOL 190 as a six-year revision.

- **NEW DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:** Eligibility for ENGL 101.
Eligibility for MATH 095

Note: This course does not currently equate with SBVC.

B. CHEM 151 General Chemistry II

Specific laboratory experiments were added to the course to meet the C-ID descriptor requirements for the state.

The committee agreed to approve CHEM 151 with a prerequisite of CHEM 150.

Note: This course currently equates with CHEM 151 at SBVC.

C. CHEM 151H General Chemistry II – Honors

Specific laboratory experiments were added to the course to meet the C-ID descriptor requirements for the state.

The committee agreed to approve CHEM 151H with a prerequisite of CHEM 150 or CHEM 150H and Acceptance into the College Honors Institute.

Note: This course currently equates with CHEM 151H at SBVC.

D. FIRET 115 Firefighter I Basic Training Academy

The course is being updated to meet the requirements for the State Fire Training curriculum criteria for Firefighter I Certification.

The committee discussed with Dan Sullivan surveying the students enrolled in FIRET 115 to determine if the student had previously taken ENGL 010 for eligibility into ENGL 101 and MATH 090 or MATH 090C for eligibility into MATH 095.

The committee agreed to approve FIRET 115 with a prerequisite of Admission to the Academy, FIRET 100, FIRET 101, EMS 020 or successful completion of the NREMT (National Registry Examination for the Emergency Medical Technician) or currently certified as an EMT in California. The Corequisite of KIN/F 049 was also approved.

- **NEW COREQUISITE:** KIN/F 049
- **NEW DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:** Eligibility for ENGL 101. Eligibility for MATH 095 or higher and successful completion of FIRET 902

A. MATH 0952L MATH 952 Prealgebra Laboratory

The committee agreed to approve MATH 0952L as a new course. The corequisite of MATH 952 was also approved.

3. SB 1440 Update

Troy reported:

The transfer degree for Chemistry will be on the agenda for the March 9th Curriculum meeting.

Economics is still in secondary review with the State.

Elementary Teacher Education requires two new courses; the Math and Geology faculty have agreed to create them.

Music will need to reduce units, possibly by offering variable unit courses.

A timeline is being developed.
