I learned about a variety of internships I could take, I learned about a variety of resources that would help me know what job options I would have, and I learned about resources that could inform me what environments I may be working in if I work those jobs.

I learned how some can benefit from an internship like getting promoted and building network of connections. I learned that there are different internships, and how you can get college credit from applying.

I learned more about majors, careers and I never knew you can get more than one majors

I learned of various useful websites for searching for jobs, I learned about the various resources I could look at to improve my teaching abilities, and what kinds of actions I could take to better improve my chances of getting the job I wanted
