

Transfer Articulation Pathway (TAP)

Crafton Hills College District and La Sierra University's Bachelor of Social Work (BSW)

Students may transfer to La Sierra University's Evening Adult Degree Program (EADP) at *anytime* if they meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Be at least 22 years of age
- Have a minimum 30 semester units/44 quarter units of transferable college/university credit
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.0

The following outlines the most *time-efficient* and *cost-effective* pathway to transfer to the Evening Adult Degree Program for the Social Work BSW degree. Due to social work course sequencing, a Fall start time is ideal and Winter is possible. EADP's academic advisor is not only available, but *encourages* students to contact the EADP office *prior* to transferring to La Sierra. Pre-planning saves you *time* and *money*. **The EADP offers tuition at a 50% rate reduction.** Complete your FAFSA, as it determines all Federal and State aid. **To contact La Sierra's EADP office: 951.785.2300 or eadp@lasierra.edu.**

Students may declare a social work major at any time, but must be admitted to the Social Work Program per requirement by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE; the accrediting body that accredits social work schools). La Sierra University has been accredited by CSWE since 1979. La Sierra's BSW program requires (in addition to specifics outlined above) 80 quarter units in social work-specific classes, and an additional 12 quarter units of required La Sierra-specific General Education classes, which must be completed at La Sierra.
