Minutes, December 10 th , 2013 (5 minutes)			The minutes were approved as written.						
<p>Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI)</p> <p>Approximately 1,130 institutions have access to CITI course site worldwide. About 35,000 people per month complete a CITI course. Since 2000, 1.3 million people have met the Federal training mandate by completing a CITI course.</p> <p>For Social/Behavioral research there are 11 modules. The CHC IRBC can determine which modules are most applicable and choose from the 11. The modules can be designed for different groups (e.g.: IRBC, students, etc.). Each module has a quiz and is updated twice a year.</p> <p>A copy of the results is sent to institutional key trainer or IRB administrator. The learner can return to the site and download a copy of the report as needed. An administrator at each institution will have access to the CITI report utilities to view the progress of individual learners or to download aggregate training data.</p> <p>Each institution can post material on CITI and develop own quizzes if choose to do so.</p> <p>CITI is not-for-profit at the University of Miami. There is an annual subscription fee. Fee for Government/Not for Profit Institutions is \$2,500. We cannot split with Valley because each site of an organization with 10 or more people or students' who conduct research need to pay the entire fee.</p>			<p>Psychology department meeting will discuss possibility of subscribing to CITI. Concern if subscription to CITI is sustainable annually. Perhaps write funds into a grant. Explore adding subscription to a grant.</p>			<p>Keith will explore finding money to pay for CITI subscription and adding a CITI subscription to a grant.</p>			
<p>National Institute of Health (NIH)</p> <p>The NIH Office of Extramural Participants has a free option for IRB training, <i>Protecting Human Research Participants</i> training module. This free web-based software consists of 7 modules, 4 of which are followed by quizzes. The entire course takes approximately 3 hours to complete.</p> <p>You can exit this program and return, logging</p>			<p>The committee agreed to participate in NIH training, but felt that CITI was more appropriate because of the ease of use and the ability to tailor the training to social and behavioral science research.</p>			<p>Keith will send out directions for the committee to complete the training.</p>			

<p>on with the same email address and password, and the program will remember which sections you have completed. If you must leave the course prior to completion, it is advised that you first complete the section in which you are working. Your progress is only recorded when you complete a section and see a check mark next to that section on the Main Menu page. The "Get Certificate" option is not available until all of the modules have been completed. Once a certificate is received can log in and retrieve it any time. If you score less than the required number of correct answers for a quiz, you must reread the module. After you reread the module, you may retake the quiz. This may be repeated until a satisfactory score has been attained.</p> <p>There is also a PDF document with all of the module training information.</p>

<p>Review changes to the database tracking the 2012-2013 submissions.</p>	<p>The committee would like to see copies of all the materials that the researcher will give to the study participants.</p>	
<p>Discuss development of an IRB Web Site</p>	<p>The web site will include links to all needed documents and a list of projects that have been approved by the committee. The web site will also include a description of the IRB Committee: designate at least one person as a non-scientist (Ginger Sutphin), designate at least one person who is primarily concerned for the welfare of the research subjects (Catherine Hendrickson), and indicate the gender of the committee members.</p>	<p>Keith will create a draft web site and include suggestions.</p>
